<u>Terrance E. Caviness Jr.</u> is the Director of Bands at Fulton High School. Mr. Caviness is co-founder and co-director of the CNY Youth Wind Ensemble, serves as Brass Instructor at SUNY Oswego and maintains a very successful private studio. In addition to his teaching duties, Mr. Caviness maintains an active performance schedule.

Dr. John Coggiola, Associate Professor of Music Education, is the Chair of the Music Education program at Syracuse University. He teaches classes on psychological and sociological aspects of music, research in music, behavioral techniques in music, technology in music education, instrumental music methods and pedagogy, and is a conductor for the Morton Schiff Jazz Ensemble. He is currently the research chairperson for the New York State School Music Association and was the co-chair of the Music Educators National Conference Special Research Interest Group in affective response to music. His research is published in The Journal for Research in Music Education, The Bulletin of The Council for Research in Music Education, The International Association of Jazz Educators Jazz Research Proceedings Yearbook, and The Instrumentalist.
