Syracuse Scholar is interested in manuscripts directed to the nonspecialized educated reader: review essays, commentaries on matters of general scholarly or public interest, discussions of controversial issues, scientific articles appropriate to a general readership, and creative literary works. Artists may offer original contributions in the graphic arts and photography. Contributions are invited from present or past members of the faculty, alumni of the graduate schools, and distinguished visitors to the campus.

All written material should be typed double spaced (including footnotes and quotations) on 8½-by-11-inch white bond and submitted in duplicate. Articles should be about 3,000–5,000 words in length (not exceeding twenty typewritten pages) and must be accompanied by a one- or two-sentence summary of content and a short biographical paragraph that includes the author's current affiliation. Manuscripts may be submitted with appropriate illustrative material and an informal photograph of the author.

Art submissions should be unpublished original work intended for the print medium. Whenever possible, prints will be taken directly from original plates, blocks, or screens. Maximum dimensions are 7 by 11 inches. The work must be capable of reproduction in only one color.
