

Cherry Rhodes is the first American to win an international organ competition. During her brilliant career she has toured extensively throughout the major music capitals of America, Europe and Asia with recitals and festival appearances in concert halls, including Lincoln Center, Kennedy Center, Orchestra Hall, Meyerson Symphony Center, the Performing Arts Center, Kimmel Center for the Performing Arts, Walt Disney Concert Hall, Royal Festival Hall, International Performing Arts Center, Philharmonic Halls of Berlin, Dortmund, and Luxembourg, the Organ and Architecture Symposium, and the renowned International September Music Festival of Montreux-Vevey (Switzerland). Other international festivals include those of Paris, Munich, Freiburg, Nurnberg, St. Albans, Luxembourg, Vienna, Bratislava, Presov, Gdansk and Warsaw, Montreal and Seoul.

She has been featured at numerous national and regional conventions of The American Guild of Organists and many of her recorded performances have been broadcast internationally and are found on several classical music recording labels. Her recording, "Everyone Dance, the organ music of Calvin Hampton," was hailed by The American Organist as "A joyous celebration of unrivaled artistry!"

Numerous composers have written and dedicated works to her, and she has edited several compositions as well. These include "Ascent" by Joan Tower, "Prelude and Variations on 'Old Hundredth'" by Calvin Hampton, "Meditations on 'Salve, Festa Dies'" and "Chorale, Diferencias and Glosas on 'Puer Natus in Bethlehem'" by Joseph Walter, and "Larry King — The Organ Music for solo organ and organ and tape."

Cherry Rhodes is Adjunct Professor of Organ at the University of Southern California, Thornton School of Music. Many of her students have won awards, grants, and top prizes in competitions in the United States and Europe. A sought-after musician, she gives master classes and frequently serves as adjudicator for competitions in North America, Europe, and Asia including the first pipe organ competition in China (Shanghai) held in 2017.
