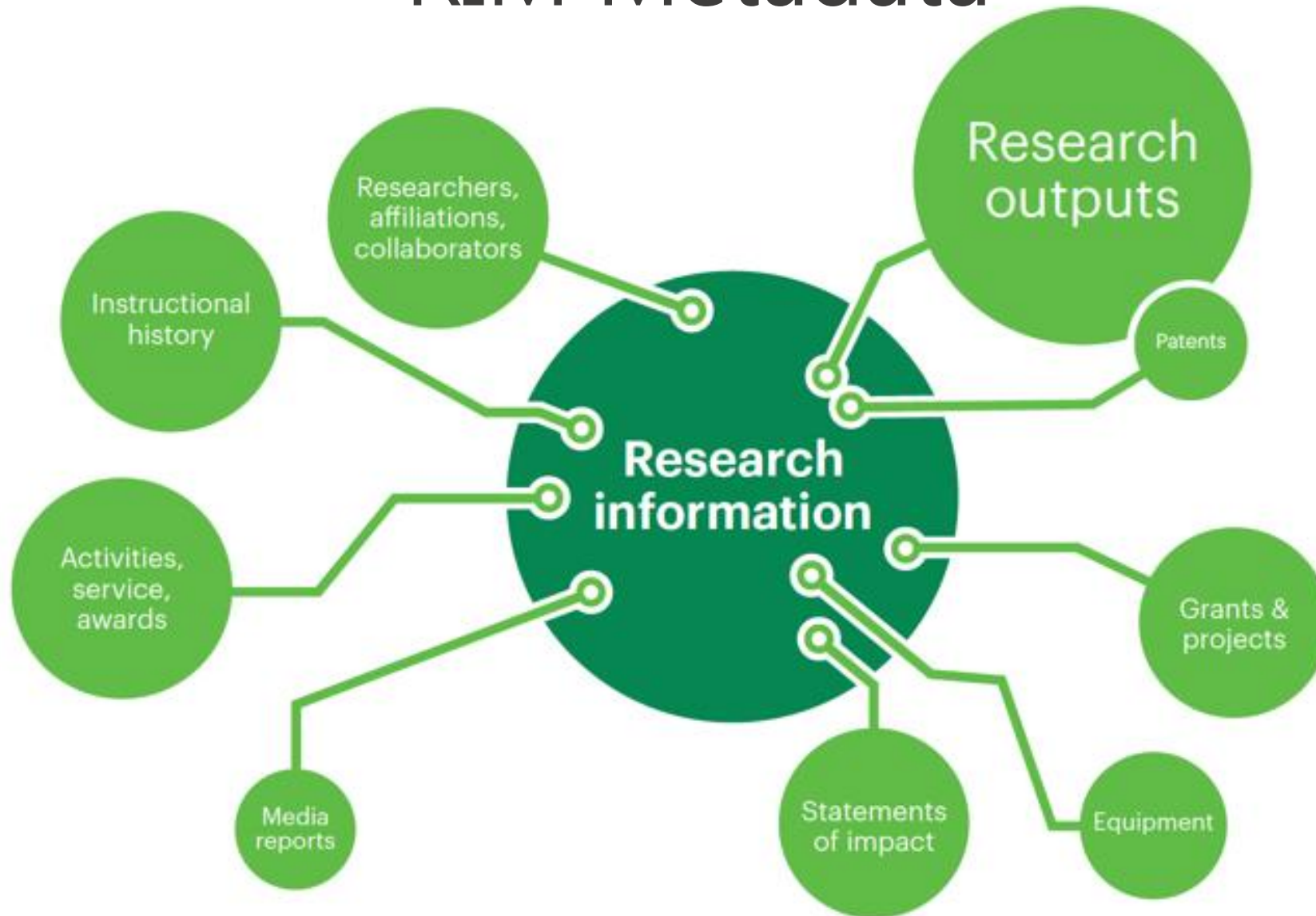

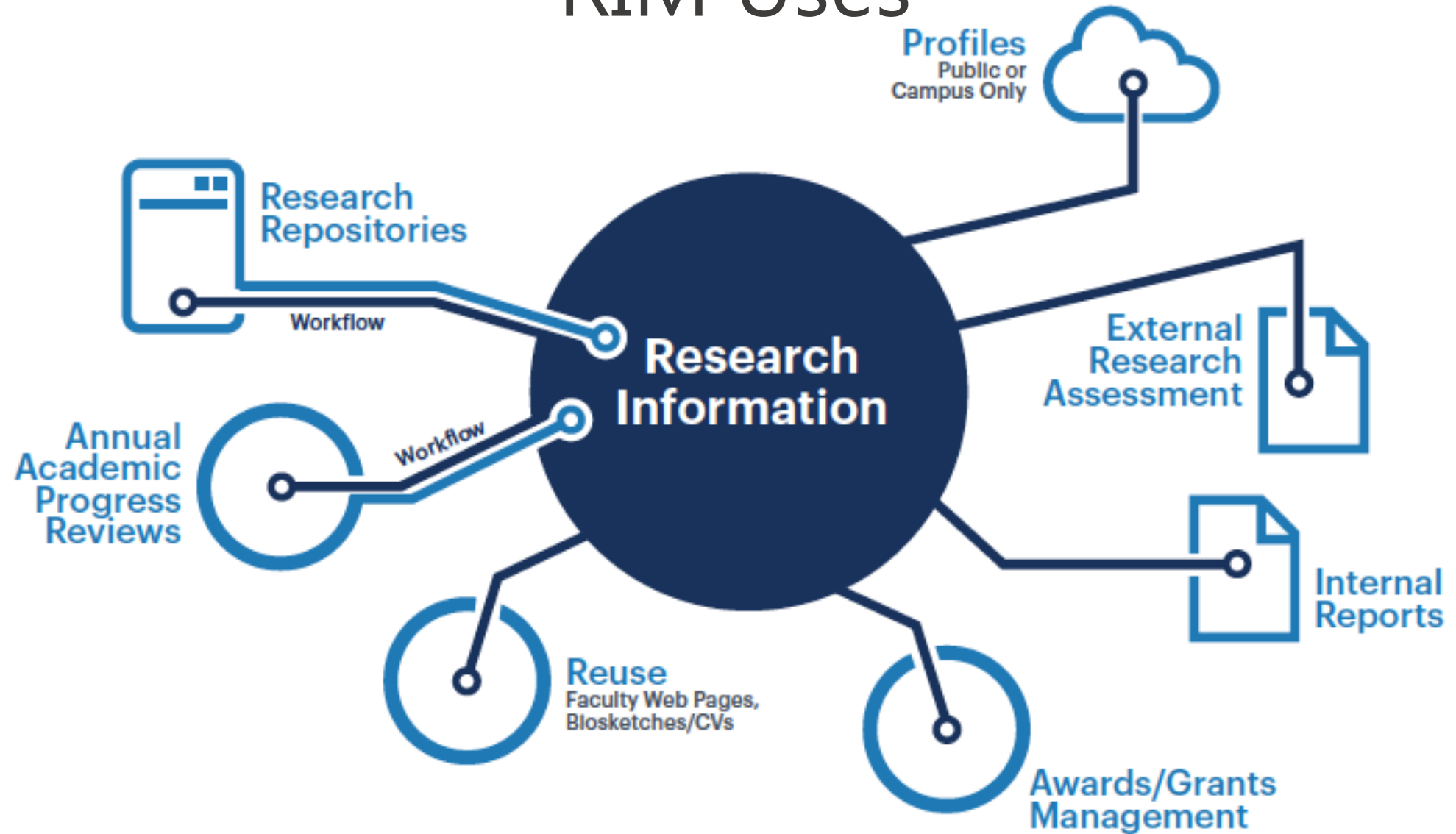
# Research Information Management

  - Research Data Management

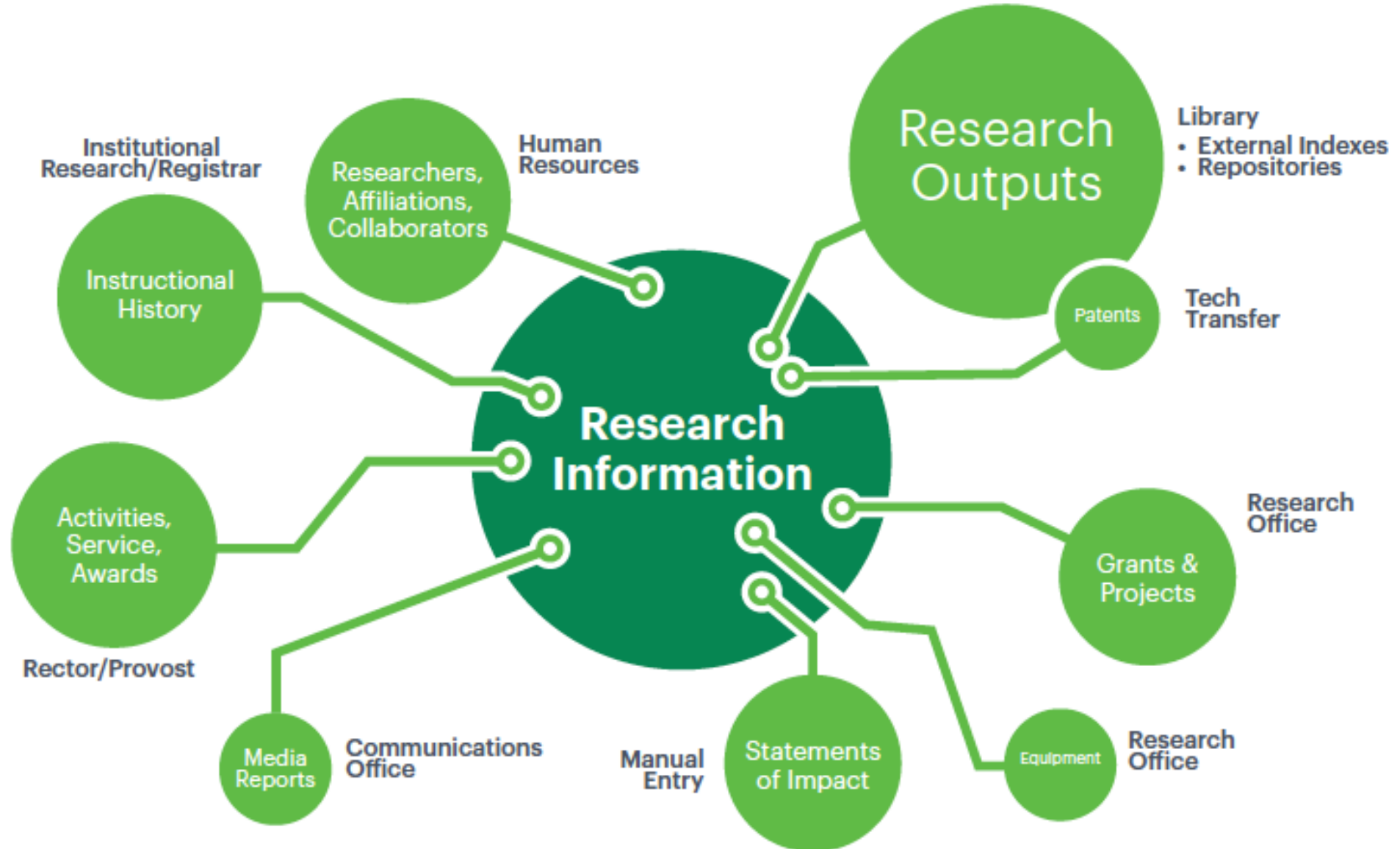

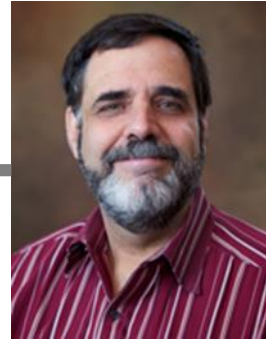

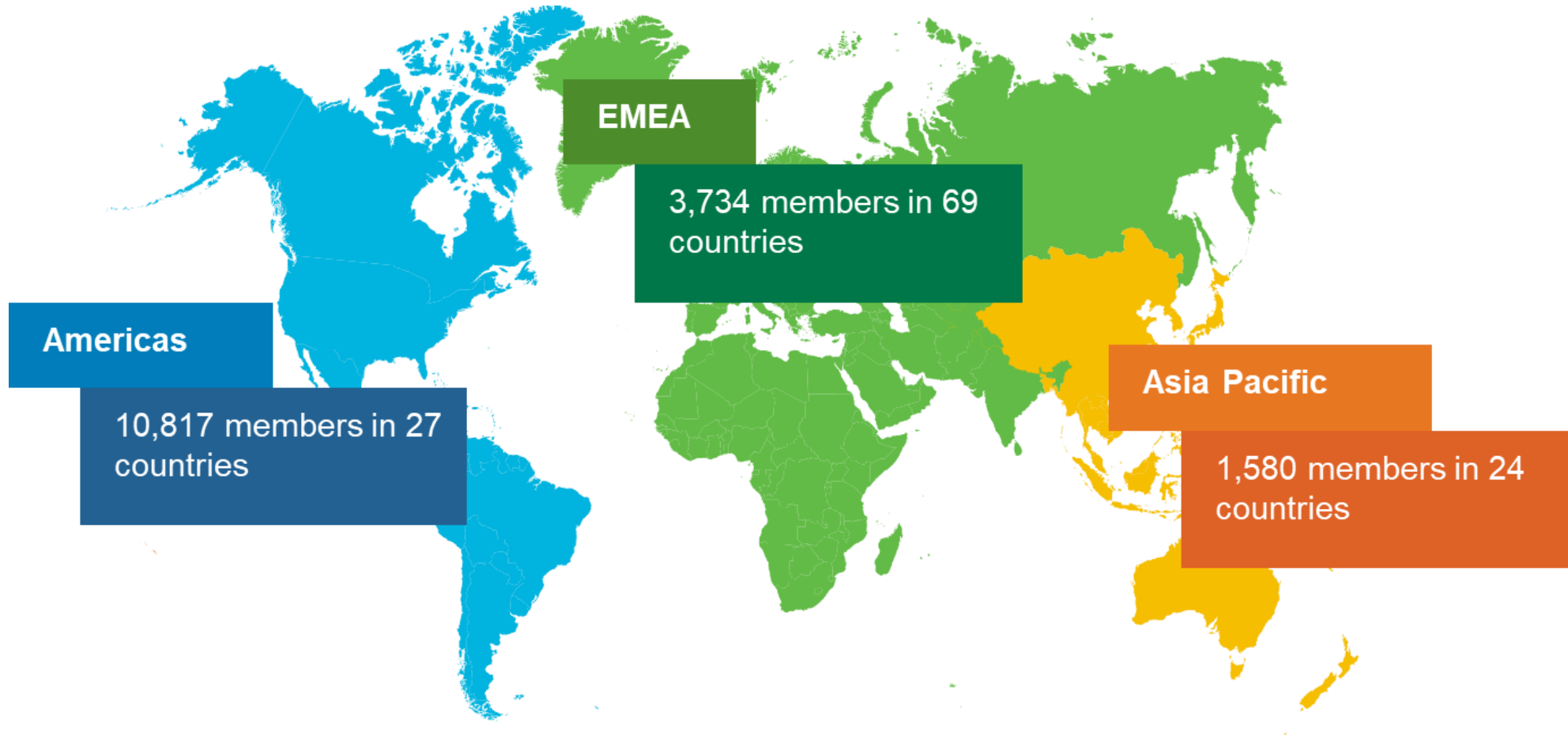
