Facing page and below: Warm, bright weather was the order of the day for the dedication of Newhouse III, as students, faculty, alumni and friends of the University celebrated the official opening of the third building of the S.I. Newhouse School of Public Communications. The Chief Justice of the United States, John G. Roberts Jr., delivered a keynote address on the First Amendment in Hendricks Chapel. The official cutting of a symbolic ribbon—a commemorative edition of the *Syracuse Record*—took place afterward. Those cutting the ribbon included the Chief Justice, Chancellor Nancy Cantor, Newhouse Dean David Rubin, and members of the Newhouse family. Newhouse III, a \$31.6 million, 74,000-square-foot addition to the Newhouse Communications Complex, was funded by a lead gift of \$15 million—one of the largest private donations in Syracuse University history—from the S.I. Newhouse Foundation and the Newhouse family, and donations from alumni and friends of the school. The words of the First Amendment to the U.S. Constitution are etched into the glass that wraps the building.
