

## SCHOLARSHIP HONORS

See Vol. I. pp. 783-787 and Vol. II. pp. 467-472

On Nov. 16, 1906 the faculty of the College of Liberal Arts adopted the following report of a committee on Grades and Commencement Honors. As slightly amended on June 3, 1907 it reads as follows:

I. That all grades of students shall be reported to the Registrar not in letters but in percentages.

II. All grades below 65 per cent shall be considered as failures.

A. All those between 45 per cent and 65 per cent may be removed by examination.

B. Those below 45 per cent may be removed only by repeating the subject in class.

III. Commencement honors shall be determined by average percentages as follows:

A. Students to receive honors must attain an average if not less than 80 per cent for all of their recorded work

B. Of such students,

1. Those who attain an average of not less than 92 per cent for the work of the entire course shall receive the first honor—*Summa Cum Laude*.

2. Those who attain an average of not less than 86 per cent for the work of the entire course shall receive the second honor—*Magna Cum Laude*.

3. All others shall receive the third honor—*Cum Laude*.

## DEPARTMENT HONORS

On June 3, 1907 the faculty adopted the following report of a Committee on Department Honors:

I. Those students who attain an average of 86 per cent in all their work of the Junior year, in any department, shall be informed of that fact during the following summer.

II. Those students who attain an average of 80 per cent in all their work of the Junior and Senior years in any department shall be entitled to *Department Honors*. Students attaining an average of 95 per cent will be awarded *first honors*; those attaining an average of 90 per cent will be awarded *second honors*.

III. A student to attain department honors must elect an average of at least six semester hours in the department for both junior and senior years.

IV. The announcement of department honors shall be made on the Commencement program.
