

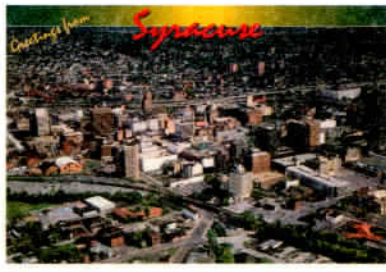

 This view looks East toward Hanover Square. In the background are three of Syracuse's historic buildings. L. to R. they are the Grady Building built in 1867, the State Tower Building built in 1929, and the Onondaga Savings Bank, built in 1899 and known as the first 'skyscraper' in Syracuse.

Though Clinton Square had a tradition of being a center of activity while the Erie Canal was still in use, it is today only filled with activity for certain cultural events throughout the year.

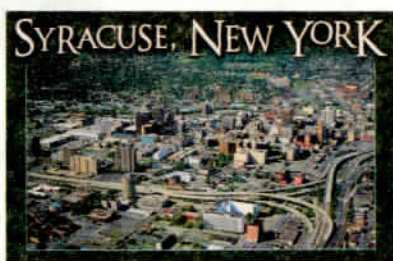

Home to the Carousel Center, one of the largest malls in NY, Onondaga County, has the one of the highest sales taxes in the country.



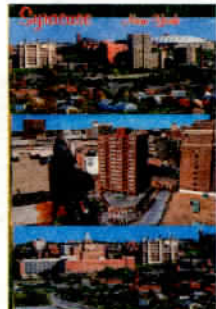
